That City Council approve the Citizens' Advisory Committee's recommendations to allocate \$148,000 in FY 2021-2022 Emergency Solutions Grant Funding; authorize the City Manager or his designee to enter into appropriate agreements of approved programs and projects as required; and administratively approve any revised final funding allocations.

**STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds may be used for five program components: street outreach, emergency shelter, homelessness prevention, rapid re-housing assistance, Homeless Client Data Collecting, as well as administrative activities (up to 7.5% of a recipient's allocation can be used for administrative activities)

The projected formula-based allocation is part statutory and part regulatory. The \$148,000 projected allocation is contingent upon the US Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) final approval. The ESG program provides funding to engage homeless individuals and families living on the streets.

The timeline for the acceptance of applications through the recommendation process is as follows:

**October 6, 2020:** The North Las Vegas Citizens' Advisory Committee (CAC) began the ESG application process.

**November 2, 2020:** Applications were opened via ZoomGrants.
