STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The City is currently undertaking litigation against various opioid manufacturers and distributors. The State of Nevada is doing the same. One of our mutual defendants, Purdue Pharmaceutical, is winding down its bankruptcy, and the court-appointed expert for claimants has applied an impact-based formula to quantify claims for all claimants on a state-by-state basis. Using this formula, the State has proposed an allocation of all settlements received by way of opioid litigation going forward, not just for the Purdue bankruptcy. It is our belief that the allocation is fair, and would also result in a better recovery for the City on a much shorter timeline than litigating these cases alone.
