Coordinator Christison provided the Committee with an update on spending for FY 2020/2021 subrecipients. She reviewed the funded amounts, the currently billed amounts and the percentage of billed. She provided details on why Lutheran Social Services and YMCA have very low-billed amounts and displayed the data below.

Coordinator Christison provided an update on COVID funding the City had received and how it was used.

She stated that funding tonight is for a two-year cycle, but that the funding amount is for the first year and that the Committee would make allocations for the second year next year. In response to Vice Chairwoman Peterson questions, Coordinator Christison stated that all applicants submitted requests for the first year with the exception of Volunteers in Medicine and that she clarified this with the applicant and the request amounted was amended for this cycle by half.

In regards to funding questions, Coordinator Christison stated the City would get new funding next, with the same kind of numbers used for this cycle. She stressed that next year there would be no new applications, but the Committee would look usage in the first year and make new recommendations to Council for the second year of funding.

5. Review, Evaluate, Prioritize and Set Funding Levels for FY 2021/2022 Public Services Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Applications and Approve Public Services CDBG Recommendations to the City Council for Consideration. (For Possible Action)

Coordinator Christison thanked members for entering their individual scores for applications in Zoom Grants. She noted that for both CDBG and ESG applications ZoomGrants took each member's tabulations and created an average ranking that the Committee can refer to in its deliberations. Coordinator Christison displayed the CDBG spreadsheet with the ZoomGrants averages and the Committee used that spreadsheet to review the CDBG requests using the spreadsheet. She stressed that the Committee should look at the last four applicants in the spreadsheet because those applicants were only supported only three or four Committee members. She stressed that the Committee could decide recommend no funding for some applicants.

Member Alpert proposed that the Committee start with the last three applicants in yellow on the spreadsheet: The Culinary Academy, Foster Kinship, and HOPELink of Southern Nevada. Committee members shared their rationale for ranking these applicants. The Committee continued through the spreadsheet going from the bottom applicants to the top, making adjustments as needed. The Committee then readjusted those recommendations to ensure that their recommendations did not exceed the available budget of \$226,800.

In response to questions, Coordinator Christison stated the Three Square food pop-up would give the city four pop-up sites.

The Committee discussed the Culinary Academy request for \$60,000. On consensus, the Committee recommended no funding this applicant.

The Committee discussed the HOPELink of Southern Nevada request for \$162,000. On consensus, the Committee recommended no funding for this applicant.

The Committee and Coordinator Christison discussed the budget, noting that the final number would not be known until the summer. Ms. Christison noted that the applicant numbers would then be increased or decreased by percentage once the City received the final budget number granted to the City.

The final CDBG recommendations for each applicant are displayed below the vote on this item.

6. Review, Evaluate, Prioritize and Set Funding Levels for FY 2021/2022 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Applications and Approve ESG Recommendations to the City Council for Consideration. (For Possible Action)

Coordinator Christison displayed and ESG spreadsheet that included the ZoomGrants averages and the Committee used that spreadsheet to review the ESG requests and make recommendations. They worked from the bottom of the list up and then made adjustments to ensure they did not exceed the \$148,000 available budget.

The Committee discussed the HOPELink of Southern Nevada request for \$62,000. On consensus, the Committee recommended no funding for this applicant. The final ESG recommendations for each applicant are displayed below the vote on this item.
