Executive Summary

- April 28, 2022, City of North Las Vegas Neighborhood and Leisure Services Department;
 North Las Vegas; Clark County; Nevada
- Category A Applicant
- The City of North Las Vegas Neighborhood and Leisure Services Department, located in southern Nevada will upgrade the irrigation system at Par 3 municipal Golf Course on the southwest corner of Cheyenne Road and North 5th Street. The project will include renovating and upgrading the existing irrigation system by removing and replacing the irrigation valves, lateral lines and sprinkler heads. To assist with the life of the new irrigation system, more a more efficient system will be installed using more modern supplies. The project's competition will help meet the water conservation goals of Southern Nevada Water Authority Water (SNWA) Water Resource Plan. Some of the benefits to this project are a more efficient irrigation system which will decrease the length of irrigation run times, decrease the amount of water used to irrigate, lower overall water and power costs. Ultimately the cost of fertilizer will also decrease because a more efficient system has better water placement which in return provides a more efficient response to fertilizer.
- It is estimated that this will be 120-day project with a projected start date of November
 2023 and a completion date of March 2024.

Project Location

This proposed project is located on municipal government land (City of North Las Vegas, Nevada) at 324 E. Brooks Ave, North Las Vegas, NV 89030. The project latitude is 36.215830 and longitude is -115.136249.

Technical Project Description

The Par 3 golf course was built in the 1960s and has undergone minor renovations throughout the years. That is what makes this renovation unique, it is a classic irrigation upgrade to an old system that has had some updates previously. Although this project does not include an actual mainline replacement, it will be a complete renovation of the already existing system from the mainline to the sprinkler heads.

This project will be contracted out to a landscape contractor and will take place in the winter months which will minimize turf loss. While working on this project the water may be temporarily turned off for 4-6 weeks. But as lateral lines and sprinkler heads are installed, the water may be able to be turned on to minimize turf loss even more.

Many items that were once a part of the current system will be replaced as a part of this project. These items include backflow preventer valves, ball valves, irrigation valves, valve boxes, lateral polyvinyl chloride lines, polyvinyl chloride fittings, sprinkler heads and nozzles. There are controllers and sprinkler heads that work with the system and will also be replaced with specifically Calsense CS-3000 TW system timer controllers and the Rainbird 8005 Rotor Heads.

It is estimated that there will be approximately 70 new irrigation valves and over 280 new sprinkler heads replaced over the course of this project. The new irrigation valves will be installed with new valve boxes and nuzzling to match precipitation rates which will be installed in the sprinkler heads. To assist with the water not being shut down to all irrigation valves during construction, the ball valves will be installed upstream so each irrigation valve can be isolated if repairs are needed. All existing lateral lines will remain underground and a water audit will take place to make sure even distribution of the irrigation took place at the end of the project.

Evaluation Criteria

<u>Evaluation Criteria A – Project Benefits</u>

The City of North Las Vegas Par 3 Golf Park operates 9-hole course and 18-hole professional disc golf course open 7 days a week that offers the best golf value in the Las Vegas valley. Open year round, both courses can be enjoyed by golfers of all ages and abilities. It is especially user-friendly for seniors and beginners because the length is not intimidating and there are no artificial hazards. But even to the more accomplished players that need that extra practice, the small greens present a challenge too.

The course is well-maintained and offers gently rolling terrain with many mature trees and a great view of the Las Vegas Valley. The course was the first lighted course in Nevada and golfers can tee off as late as 7:00 pm during the Fall/Winter season and 8:30 pm during the Spring/Summer season.

There is also a small coffee shop and pro shop located in the clubhouse, featuring top of the line ball and disc golf products.

The irrigation renovation project is overdue, and will improve the condition of the golf course and provide continued enjoyment of those using the facility for many years to come.

The project also helps meet the water conservation goals of Southern Nevada Water Authority Water (SNWA) Water Resource Plan.

Project Benefits

Anticipated water management benefits include having a more efficient irrigation system which will decrease water window (length of irrigation run times). This project will also decrease the amount of water used to irrigate, while decreasing the costs of water and power. There will be lower costs associated with fertilizer because the more efficient the system is, the better water placement which provides more efficient response to fertilizer.

The significance of the anticipated water management benefits: Currently, Southern

Nevada is in a federal government issued water shortage declaration — which mandated the

amount of water Southern Nevada can withdraw from Lake Mead beginning in January 2022.

Combined with existing water reductions outlined in the Southern Nevada Water Authority

(SNWA) Drought Contingency Plan, the declared shortage will cut Southern Nevada's annual

water allocation by nearly 7 billion gallons in 2022. This is enough water to serve more than

40,000 households for a year. Should Lake Mead's water level continue to decline, additional

cuts will follow. The significance of the anticipated water management benefit is to upgrade the

current system as this project is proposing.

This project will enable the Par 3 golf course to install a more efficient irrigation system and will reduce the amount of water used to irrigate the turf and trees.

Broader Benefits

This project will benefit the community by showing that water can be conserved by installing a more efficient irrigation system. This project will maximize water distribution and coverage, while reducing the amount of water used compared to the existing older irrigation system. This project will also set the example for other municipalities and golf courses – by committing to modern, efficient irrigation systems.

- Will the proposed project increase collaboration and information sharing among water managers in the region?
 Yes, annual water use can be easily measured by taking readings from water meters. If water is reduced then other municipalities can use our data to assist with irrigation renovations at their parks and golf courses.
- Will proposed project positively impact various sectors and economies?
 There will always be a positive impact when irrigation can be reduced and water conservation is maximized yet still have green turf for golfers to recreate on.
- Will project complement work done in coordination with NRCS in the area?
 All data will be shared with SNWA and will complement their Water Resource Plan.
- 4. Will the project help address drought conditions?Yes, reduction in water use will likely occur as a result of this project.

Evaluation Criteria B – Planning Efforts Supporting the Project

The project is supported by the overall SNWA Water Resource Plan. This project supports this plan in reducing the amount of irrigation used at the CNLV Par 3 Golf course. We have received full support from SNWA for this project.

This project is not specifically called out in any CNLV planning documents.

This project is a priority with water conservation for CNLV. In addition to turf conversion/removal projects in parks, installation of modern irrigation systems will also provide more efficient water system which will use less water.

Evaluation Criteria C – Implementation and Results

This project will be contracted out to a Landscape Contractor. We will publish the notice on Nevada Government eMarketplace (NGEM) and likely receive several bids. We will go with the lowest responsible bid and then work with the contractor on project schedule and completion date. We are hopeful this project can be completed in colder winter months and are looking at a start date of November 2023 and completion date of March 2024. Permits will be the responsibility of the landscape contractor. Engineering and plans will be provided by CNLV Public Works engineers. No new policies or actions will be needed for this project. Environment and cultural resource compliance are not needed for this project.

It is difficult to say because water will still be used. We will still be taking water from Lake Mead and not replenishing it. However, with this project less water will be needed compared to what is currently occurring. If we do not complete this project then there will be no change to the water use – it may even increase due to an inefficient irrigation system.
